Ambassador delivered a lecture at the National Defence University

On 15 May, 2014, H.E. Mr. Hiroshi Inomata, Ambassador of Japan to Pakistan, delivered a lecture at the National Defence University (NDU) in Islamabad.

NDU is the premier institution in Pakistan, which acts as a national think tank, with its mission to impart higher education in policy and strategy formulation with emphasis on national security and defence, for both military and civilian officers who are expected to play significant role in the country.

In the lecture, Ambassador Inomata explained about the bilateral relationship between Japan and Pakistan, as well as Japan's first ever National Security Strategy (NSS) which was adopted in December 2013. Ambassador Inomata explained in detail about the policy of "Proactive Contribution to Peace", which is the key concept of the NSS.

The audience keenly listened to Ambassador Inomata's lecture and a lively question and answer session ensued. At the closing session, Ambassador Inomata expressed his gratitude to the NDU for inviting him to deliver the lecture.
