

Japan's Humanitarian Assistance for the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa/FATA crisis

May 2010

Japan has funded a total of US\$ 70.76million for the immediate relief and early recovery of the vulnerable population in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa/ FATA since September 2008.

This funding is a response to the appeal of the humanitarian community, and has been used for the provision of food, shelter, medical services, water and sanitation, and community restoration through various international organizations such as the World Food Programm (WFP), the United Nations Development Plan (UNDP), the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR), the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and the International Red Cross Society (ICRC).
