

Complete Picture of Japan's Assistance against the 2005 Earthquake in Pakistan

1. Disaster Relief Teams

(1) Search & Rescue Team (49 members)

-During 10-14 October 2005 at Battagram, NWFP

(2) Medical Teams (42 members in total of 1st & 2nd teams)

-During 12-30 October 2005 at Battagram, NWFP

-2,271 patients provided medical care

-Japanese NGOs took over this services

(3) Self-Defense Force Units

-Air transport of afflicted people & relief goods between Islamabad & Battagram

-During 17 October-the end of November 2005



2. Emergency Relief Goods

-Arrived at Islamabad on 11 October 2005

-Approx US\$0.23 million worth of goods (2,000 blankets, 768 plastic containers, sleeping mats, 30 tents, 20 water purifiers, 20 electric generators, 30 cord reels, 20 plastic sheets, 5 portable water tanks)



3. NGO Activities (JPY 560 million)

(1) NGOs under the Japan Plat Form (JPF) engaged in medical assistance with ODA support (approx JPY 440 million)

(2) JPF launched "Camp Japan", wintering camp, at Muzaffarabad with ODA support (approx JPY120 million)

4. Soft Loan (approx US\$100million)

-Announced on 19 November 2005 and signed on 5 January 2006

-Budget support to meet financial need for emergency reconstruction

5. Emergency Grant Assistance (approx US\$ 75 million)

(1) 11 October 2005 (US\$ 20 million)

➤ US\$12 million to procure supplies

(6500 tents, 6,500 plastic sheets, 21,000 sleeping mats, 42,000 blankets, 13,000 plastic containers, pharmaceutical and heavy machineries)

➤ US\$ 8 million through international organizations

(WFP:US\$2.5m, UNICEF:US\$2.5m, UNHCR:US\$1m, WHO:US\$1m, IOM:US\$1m)

(2) 5 January 2006 (US\$ 55 million)

➤ US\$ 20 million through international organizations

(UNDP:US\$5 m, WFP:\$2.45m, UNICEF:US\$2m, UNFPA:US\$1.3m, UNESCO:US\$1.3m, UNHABITAT:US\$0.15m,ICRC:US\$5m, IFRC:US\$2.8m)

➤ US\$35 million as a Non Project Grant Aid

-24 medical & 99 educational facilities and 1 bridge in Battagram

-Completed in August 2010



6. Assistance through the Japan Trust Funds (US\$ 10 million)

US\$ 5 million was disbursed to WB & ADB respectively upon their requests

7. Emergency Development Study in Muzaffarabad

(1) Draw up a Hazard Map for landslides, (2) Formulate programs on land utilization, (3) Formulate a plan of priority sectors for rehabilitation & reconstruction

8. Rehabilitation of Bridges

In Jhelum Valley Road leading to LOC

Loan : approx US\$ 100 million

Grant: approx US\$ 90 million
