# Japan's Assistance against the 2010 Flood in Pakistan

**April 2011** 

### 1. Emergency Relief Goods (US\$ 400,000)

Relief goods (drainage pumps, tents & water purifiers etc.) arrived in August & September 2010.

#### 2. Disaster Relief Team

### (1) Helicopters of the Self-Defense Forces

- -Three UH-1s & three UH-47s operated based in Multan.
- -The helicopters airlifted 260 tons in total of relief goods by 10 October 2010.

## (2) Medical Team (46 members in total of 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> teams)

- -During 4-23 September 2010 in southern Punjab
- -Approx 3,500 patients provided medical care





#### 3. Emergency Grant Assistance through international organizations (US\$280 million)

(1) August 3<sup>rd</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup>, 2011 (US\$13 million in total)

(WFP: \$6m, UNICEF: \$3m, UNHCR: \$2m, WHO: \$1m, IOM: \$0.5m, UNFPA: \$0.5m)

(2) November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2011 (US\$267 million)

(UNICEF: \$17m, UNHCR: \$59m, IOM: \$15m, WFP: \$60m, WFP/UNHAS: \$10m,

OCHA: \$1m, UNDP: \$50m, UNDP/UNV: \$0.4m, HABITAT: \$44m, UNFPA: \$0.5m, ICRC: \$8m, IFRC: \$1.5m)

## 4. Soft Loan (US\$233 million in total)

- (1) Budget support to import items for reconstruction (US\$59 million)
- (2) Rehabilitation of roads and bridges in KP (US\$174 million)

These assistances, together with 3(2)above, totaling US\$500 million were announced on the occasion of the Pakistan Development Forum in 15November 2011.

#### 5. Grant Assistance through NGO(US\$6.6 million)

-Local NGO: Al-Khidmat Foundation in Charsandda (US\$400,000),

Pakistan Red Crecent Society in NOwshera (US\$200,000)

-Japanese NGO: Japan Plat Form (JPF) (US\$ 6 million)

### 6. Road rehabilitation by switching from on-going project (US\$48 million)

Rehabilitation of rural roads construction in Sindh (2<sup>nd</sup> phase)

#### 7. Other assistances

- -A Japanese expert joined in the UNESCO investigation team
- -A joint Red Cross team of Japan, Australia and France engaged in relief activities in Dadu
- -Five Japanese experts joined the Damage Needs Assessment led by WB & ADB
